









































## Governor Northam: Please Visit the Limperts' Old Growth Forest in Bath County and See Why You Should Oppose the Atlantic Coast and Mountain Valley pipelines

Dear Governor Northam,

We are Virginia leaders of all races, ages, religions, and backgrounds representing every corner of our great Commonwealth. We write to you today out of our conviction that clean water, clean air, and a healthy community are basic moral rights for every resident of the Commonwealth.

But energy companies Dominion Energy and EQT/NextEra are trying to force two massive and unnecessary pipelines for fracked gas through Virginia: The Atlantic Coast Pipeline and the Mountain Valley Pipeline. These gas superhighways, if built, would lock us into the failed and polluting energy paradigm of the last century. As you read this letter, tree-felling and construction are already underway in communities across Virginia to make room for these pipelines. But it's not too late for you, Governor, to see the impacts for yourself and to direct your key environmental agency to protect Virginians and their water from these projects.

The home of Bill and Lynn Limpert in Bath County represents what's at stake. Their property, known locally as "Miracle Ridge," is home to some of the most pristine old-growth forest land in the country. Many of these trees pre-date our country's founding, including a 300-year-old sugar maple the Limperts have named "Ona"— an old Hebrew name meaning, appropriately, "graceful." Dominion's Atlantic Coast Pipeline would cut right through the Limperts' land, killing these irreplaceable trees and taking 30 feet off the top of Miracle Ridge.

Bill and Lynn have opened their home and land to people from across the region to bear witness to some of the treasures that Virginians could be forced to sacrifice for these two unnecessary fracked-gas

pipelines. Dozens of people from Bath County and beyond have already spent time on the Limperts' land this summer. Now we ask that you join the Limperts — before the summer ends — for a tour of Miracle Ridge.

You have consistently and publicly stated your desire to hold these two pipeline projects to the highest environmental standards. We believe that such a standard can be met only by rejecting the one-size-fits-all Nationwide Permit 12 process in favor of a comprehensive stream-by-stream analysis under Clean Water Act Section 401. In addition to visiting the Limperts property and seeing for yourself what's at stake, we join the chorus of legislators, faith leaders, landowners, scientists, and other leaders in asking you to direct the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to require an individual review of stream crossings under section 401 of the Clean Water Act.

Your help has never been more urgently needed. Construction of the ACP could begin in Bath County — and beyond — in a few short months. Construction of the MVP is already underway. The choices you make regarding these pipelines will profoundly affect the people of Virginia for decades to come. Please do the right thing.
